Patrice serves Gainesville by working to minimize the cost of producing electricity. Here are her tips to save energy at home:



- Keep your thermostat at 68 degrees in the winter and 78 degrees in the summer.
- Wash your clothes in cold water only. About 80 percent of energy used when you wash clothes is for heating the water.
- Use glass or ceramic pans when cooking in the oven because it allows you to reduce the temperature by 25 degrees.
