1. SUMMARY

The plant was on reserve shutdown all of June. There were no safety or environmental incidents. However, there was an incident at the tipper in which a truck driver damaged his trailer door, and an employee driving a company truck hit a deer. There were no injuries (except to the deer).

Operations:

The plant was called to start-up for normal operations on 6/20 and approximately 2 hours later told to return to standby. The unit has been available for 720 hours this month.

The boiler and main steam lines remain in a dry lay-up with a nitrogen cap. The DA/ Feedwater tank continue to be in a wet lay-up with a nitrogen cap and the turbine/condenser is being supplied with a dehumidified air purge. We continue to receive dry fuel (to be covered).

6. OPERATIONS

There was no electrical generation during the month.

A total of 90 trucks were unloaded with 2338.54 tons of wood received.

There were a total of 84 Safe Work Permits, 41 LOTOs, and 9 Confined Space Permit issued.

GREC was directed by GRU to start-up for normal operations. Two hours later GRU called back and told GREC to return to standby.

7. WATER CHEMISTRY

- **Cooling Tower:** Continue to recirculate CT basin in order to maintain chemistry.
- **Boiler/ Make-Up Water**: Periodically running the make-up water system to flush and maintain readiness.
- Well/Reclaim Water: Reclaim water has been secured and well water use as been curtailed while in Reserve Shutdown.
- **ZDS:** ZDS systems are in standby.
- **Potable water:** Completed and submitted monthly and quarterly samples, including Bacteria.

8. FUEL HANDLING

- Received 90 trucks of wood fuel.
- PMs performed on belts and machines.
- Fuel pile turning completed.

9. TRAINING

- GPiLearn: 37 individuals completed 120 total courses in June.
