#### 6. OPERATIONS

GREC ran for 720 hours through the month. There were 63,909.49 nMWhs generated during the month of April. GREC experienced one Derate to 70 nMWhs for 56 minutes when a metering bin went empty. We found an issue with the control logic for the affected side and will address when shutdown.

A total of 6 trucks were unloaded with tons of wood received.

There was a total of 85 Safe Work Permits, 39 LOTOs, and 6 Confined Space Permit issued.

#### 7. WATER CHEMISTRY

- Cooling Tower: All chemistry in normal parameters.
- **Boiler/ Make-Up Water**: Water treatment systems have run well and boiler chemistry all well within normal operating parameters.
- Well/Reclaim Water: Well water and reclaim systems were operated during the month. Reclaim water was taken out of service by Alachua for two days due to water quality issues.
- **ZDS**: Performing Crystallizer Flash Tank boil-outs due to buildup on tank walls.
- Potable water: Completed and submitted monthly and quarterly samples, including Bacteria. Completed and submitted the Florida DEP Monthly Operation Report for PWS.

#### 8. FUEL HANDLING

- Received trucks of wood.
- Water misting has been added to conveyor 1 to aid with dust control.
- New sampling doors have been added to all three bays to more safely draw wood samples.

#### 9. TRAINING

- Replaced copper lines to bag puffer valves, ash silo.
- Cleaned all nozzles on pugmill chute.
- Repaired HP-1 drain valve faulty limit switch.
- Cooling tower blowdown sensor cleaned and replaced.
- Replaced both mercury switches on # 8 belt, fuel yard.
- Inspected and repaired SWP inboard oil seal.
- Vendor investigated the issues with "A" instrument air compressor.
- SKF took vibration readings on all running equipment.
- IC/E repaired Boiler feed pump high temp alarm.
- IC/E repaired Bay # 3 hydraulic pump issue.
- IC/E adjusted zero speed switch on # 8 belt.
- IC/E adjusted and repaired the indicator level on ash silo.
- Scheduled work orders for April 443. Completed work orders 183.
